## **Report on World AIDS Day Celebration**

**Date:** 3rd December 2024

**Organized by:** CPR Hospital, Kolhapur

**Participants:** 3rd Semester B.Sc. Nursing Students, Parvatidevi Kumbhar College of Nursing, Kolhapur.

To observe World AIDS Day, CPR Hospital, Kolhapur, invited Parvatidevi Kumbhar College of Nursing to take part in an awareness program on 3rd December 2024. The event aimed to educate people about HIV/AIDS and promote its prevention and support in the community. The program included speeches, a rally, and a skit performed by students.

The program began at 7:30 AM with an enthusiastic crowd of participants and guests. The event was attended by notable personalities, including Sagar Talashikar, a well-known actor from the Marathi film industry, and the AIDS Control Officer of Kolhapur. The AIDS Control Officer gave the opening speech, explaining the current situation of HIV/AIDS in the region. The speech highlighted the importance of early detection, spreading awareness, and fighting the stigma surrounding the disease. Following this, Sagar Talashikar spoke to the audience, encouraging them to take responsibility for raising awareness and supporting people living with HIV/AIDS. At Bindu Chowk, the students performed a skit to educate the public about HIV/AIDS. 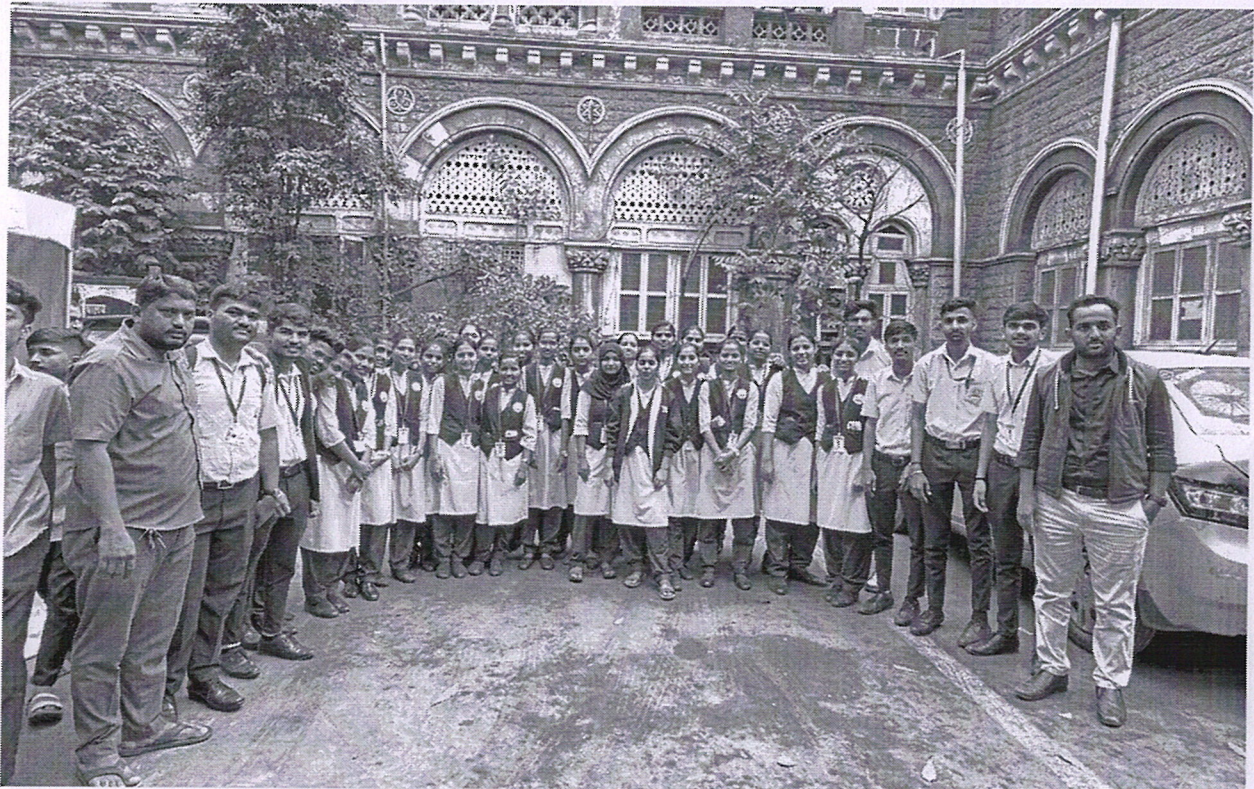
The program had a significant impact on society by spreading awareness about HIV/AIDS among a wide audience. The speeches, rally, and skit addressed common

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## **\*Report on Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti Swachhata Abhiyan at Ratnappa Kumbhar Nagar, Kolhapur\***

On October 2nd, Parvati Devi Kumbhar College of Nursing observed Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti by organizing a Swachhata Abhiyan (Cleanliness Drive) at Ratnappa Kumbhar Nagar (R.K. Nagar), Kolhapur. 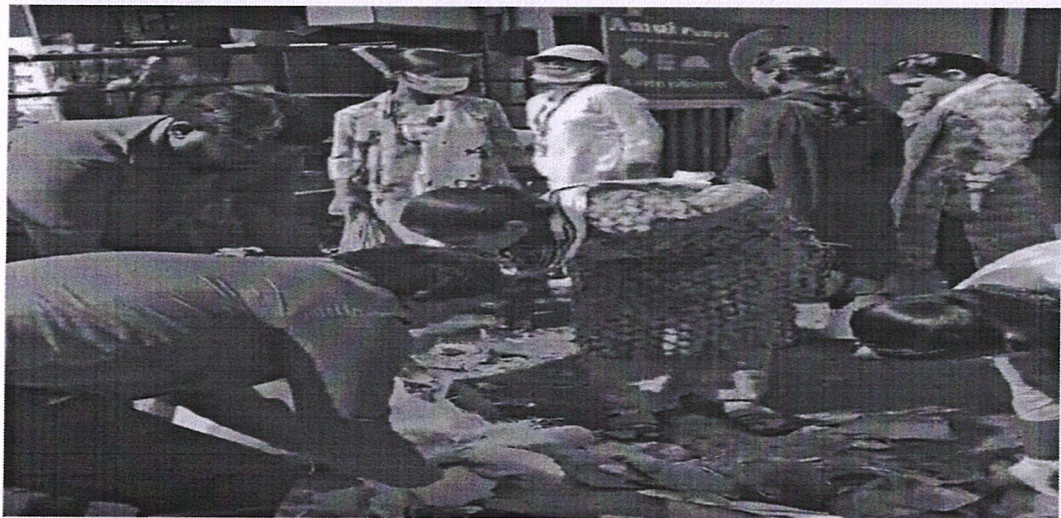

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## **Report on Guest Lecture: Basics of ECG**

**Date:** 18 December 2024.

**Guest Speaker:** Dr. Ganesh alias Soham Kulkarni.

A guest lecture on the "Basics of ECG" was organized for the 1st and 3rd Semester B.Sc. Nursing students of Parvatidevi Kumbhar College of Nursing, Kolhapur. The event was planned to provide students with a thorough understanding of ECG (Electrocardiogram), emphasizing its importance in medical practice and its role in patient care. This program aligned with the college's aim to enhance the practical and theoretical knowledge of its students.

After the main lecture, a doubt-clearing session was held. Students were encouraged to ask questions, and the interactive environment allowed for a fruitful exchange of knowledge. The queries ranged from technical aspects of ECG interpretation to its broader implications in patient care. Dr. Kulkarni patiently addressed each question, ensuring that all participants



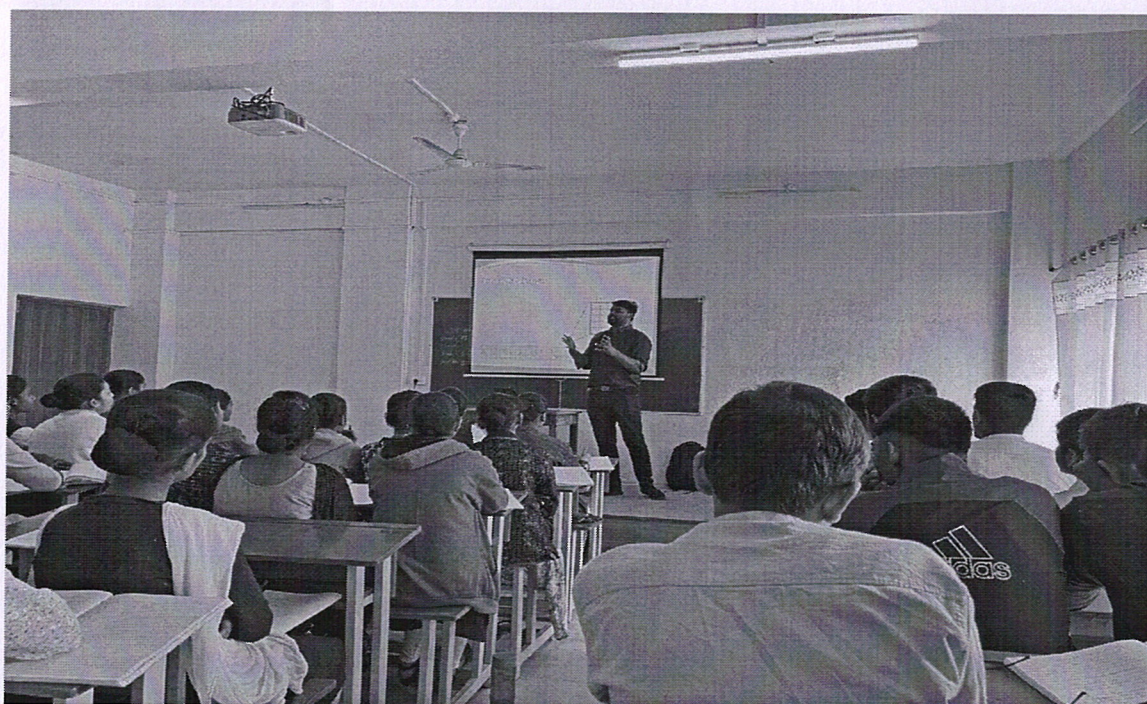
gained clarity on the topic. This session not only boosted the confidence of the students but also sparked their curiosity to explore the subject further.
